*Steven M. Wolf, M.D., Honored for Enriching the Lives of Children with Epilepsy*

New York, NY (December 12, 2011) On Tuesday, December 13 2011, Steven M. Wolf, M.D., Director of Pediatric Epilepsy and Co-Director of the Epilepsy Unit at Beth Israel Medical Center, will receive the Zella Bronfman Butler Award from the UJA-Federation of New York's Task Force on People with Disabilities and The J.E. and Z.B. Butler Foundation.

The annual Zella Bronfman Butler Awards honor three professionals in UJA-Federation's network of agencies who exemplify the highest standards of service. This year, the Innovation Award, a new category, was added to celebrate an individual who has made a major transformative contribution to the field of disabilities. Dr. Wolf will be receiving this new and illustrious award in recognition of his compassion and commitment to enriching the lives of children and adults with physical, developmental, and learning disabilities.

Dr. Wolf is Director of Pediatric Epilepsy at Beth Israel Medical Center. Under Dr. Wolf's direction, the pediatric epilepsy practice at Beth Israel Medical Center serves thousands of children each year who range from having one to two seizures a week to hundreds of seizures a day, and whose conditions include various forms of mental and physical developmental disabilities. As director of the Developmental Disabilities Center at St. Luke's-Roosevelt Hospital Center and Beth Israel Medical Center, Dr. Wolf has become a recognized leader in the study and care of those living with disabilities and epilepsy. The center is unique to New York City, and few other medical homes are as comprehensive. Dr. Wolf manages a team of seven doctors from different disciplines to serve children and adults with disabilities.

"For more than 20 years, Dr. Wolf has worked tirelessly to provide the highest quality medical care to children and families dealing with the devastating consequences of pediatric epilepsy," says Harris M.
